Please try the following:

- 1. Run the add-ons manager (menu Tools > add-ons manager)
- 2. Select standard installation
- 3. Look for an add-on called "JRE 32bits for Windows"
- 4. Check it for installation.
- 5. Next, Finish.
- 6. Reboot gvSIG.

This forces gvSIG to use a 32bits compatible JRE.
